

1.	PURPOSE		
1.1	Playing, competing, and representing Logan High School (LHS) is a privilege. Student leaders and student-athletes at LHS are held in the highest regard and are seen as role models in the community. Student leaders and athletes have the responsibility to portray their team, their school and themselves in a positive manner at all times.		
	Texting, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat and other social media sites have increased in popularity globally, and are used by the majority of student leaders/student-athletes at LHS.		
	Student leaders and student-athletes should be aware that third parties including the media, faculty, future employers and school officials could easily access social media profiles and view all personal information. This includes all pictures, videos, comments, posts, and posters. Inappropriate material found by third parties affects the perception of the student leaders and student-athletes, LHS athletics, and the school. This can also be detrimental to a student leader and student-athlete's future employment options, whether in sports or in other industries.
